What We're Learning

Students will be summarizing main ideas and analyzing organizational patterns in informational texts.

WEITING: Students will be researching and writing a persuasive essay on a science topic.

Social STUDIES: Students will be learning about the industrial revolution.

What can parents do to foster reading comprehension of informational texts?

- 1. Encourage your child to preview the headings in an informational text before reading. Pick one or two of the headings and ask your child to discuss what he or she expects to read about under that heading. Then, read those sections of the text together.
- 2. Preview the words in bold type in a section of an informational text. Check to see if the word is defined or explained in a glossary (located at the back of the book). Discuss the words in bold type before your child reads the informational text.
